CLASSES:

- 1. 18" Under Saddle-** Restricted to rider/horse combination that DO NOT compete in classes with fence heights above 2'3" at this MHJA/USEF show. Horses shown at walk/trot.
- 2. 18" Over Fences:** Simple course not to exceed 18". To be ridden at trot (some canter not to be penalized). Same restrictions as Class 1.
- 3. 18" Over Fences:** See Class 2.
- 4. Short Stirrup Hunter Under Saddle:** Walk, trot, canter. May be asked to back. Restricted to *junior rider and horse combination* that DO NOT compete in classes with fence height above 2'3" at this MHJA/USEF show.
- 5. Short Stirrup Over Fences:** Fences not to exceed 2'. Same restrictions as class 4
- 6. Short Stirrup Over Fences:** Fences not to exceed 2'. See Class 5.
- 7. Long Stirrup Hunter Under Saddle:** Walk, trot, canter. May be asked to back. Restricted to *adult amateur rider and horse combinations* that do not compete in classes with fence height exceeding 2'3" in this MHJA/USEF show.
- 8. Long Stirrup Over Fences:** Fences not to exceed 2'. Same restrictions as Class 7.
- 9. Long Stirrup Over Fences:** See Class 8.
- 10. 2'3" Hunter Under Saddle:** Walk, trot, canter-may be asked to back
- 11. 2'3" Hunter Over Fences:** Fences not to exceed 2'3".
- 12. 2'3" Hunter Over Fences:** See Class 11
- 13. 2'6" Hunter Under Saddle:** Walk, trot, canter. May be asked to back
- 14. 2'6" Hunter Over Fences:** Fences not to exceed 2'6"
- 15. 2'6" Hunter Over Fences:** See Class 14.
- 16. 0.80 m Jumper:** Fences not to exceed 0.80 meters (2'7"). Table IV. Round is timed and placings based on time closest to announced OPTIMUM TIME. See MHJA Rules for full details.
- 17. 0.80 m Jumper:** see Class 16
- 18. 0.85 m Jumper:** Fences not to exceed 0.85 m (2'9"). Table II, Section 1-First round is timed.
- 19. 0.85 m Jumper:** See Class 18.
- 20. 0.90 m Jumper:** Fences not to exceed 0.90m (2'11"). Table II, Section 1-First round is Timed
- 21. 0.90 m Jumper:** See Class 21.
- 22. 1.0 m Jumper:** Fences not to exceed 1.0m (3'3"). Table II, Section 1-First round is Timed
- 23. 1.0 m Jumper:** See Class 22.

General Information

MHJA membership applications MUST be received by MHJA within 2 weeks of this show for the show's points to count towards MHJA year-end awards. Please visit the MHJA website at www.montanahunterjumper.org for membership forms. NO APPLICATIONS FOR MHJA MEMBERSHIP WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE SHOW OFFICE.

Awards: Ribbons will be given to 6 places in all classes. Championship and Reserve Championships will be awarded in all divisions. For all Hunter classes, points are tallied for the over fences classes first. Only the four horses with the most points over fences receive Under Saddle points to determine the division champion and reserve. Points for MHJA Year-End Awards are submitted ONLY for MHJA members.

Schooling will be offered from 2:30-6:30 on Friday, May 3. We will start with cross rails, followed by 2' and 2'6", with jumps being lowered back to cross rails at the end. Schooling rounds are \$5/round, and riders can school multiple rounds. Coaches are welcome to help with schooling rounds, but time will be limited for each round to ensure that all riders have ample opportunity for schooling. Schooling will end promptly at 6:30 so the arena and course can be prepared for the show. Riders wanting to school on the day of the show may enter a class (at \$9/ride) one level below the level they plan to show and not be judged for that class.

Stabling: There are 12 x 12 box stalls with sliding doors available on the Park grounds for \$35.00/night. Stabling MUST be reserved before the show by calling (406) 728-3830 and leaving a message.

Directions to Park: The Big Sky Horse Park is located at 35th and North Avenue, west of Missoula. From I-90, take the Reserve Street exit and go south to the intersection of South Avenue and Reserve (the corner with Rosauers, ShopKo, Holiday Gas, and the sign to Fort Missoula). Turn west (right) on South Avenue. Turn north (right) on Tower, just after Big Sky High School. Turn west (left) on North and right into the Equestrian Park.

From the Bitterroot Valley, take 93 North to the intersection of South Avenue and Reserve (the corner with Rosauers, ShopKo, Holiday gas, and the sign to Fort Missoula). Turn west (left) on South Avenue and follow above.

ALL RIDERS ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR AN ANSI APPROVED HELMET AT ALL TIMES WHEN MOUNTED ON SHOW GROUNDS. RIDERS, TRAINERS, OWNERS, AND SPECTATORS PARTICIPATE AT THEIR OWN RISK.

To Our Competitors and Supporters:

Happy Spring! We are back for the 28th year for this Hunter/Jumper Schooling Show. As the show organizers look at each other, we realize that we are a little older, a little more gray, and a little more stiff than we used to be. (Like maybe 20+ years older, grayer, and stiffer!) Therefore, I am including my usual plea for helping hands during the show.

If you or someone who comes to the show with you can volunteer a couple of hours during the show to help at the Out Gate, hand out ribbons, or help as part of the jump crew, it will make a huge difference for the small group that brings you this show each year. Opening and closing the Out Gate can be done in conjunction with sitting most of the time and allows the volunteer to watch the action. Handing out ribbons entails hanging out around the Secretary's Stand and walking out into the arena at the end of each class. Again, much time can be spent sitting and watching the fun.
